

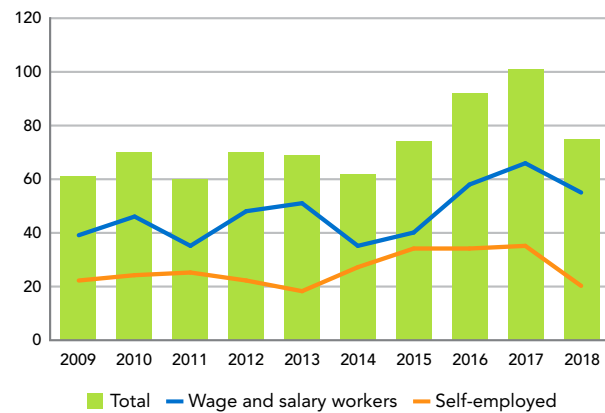
FATAL OCCUPATIONAL INJURIES

In 2018, one Minnesota worker died every 5 days.

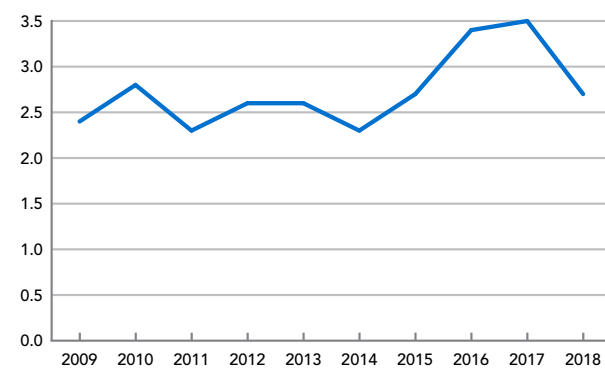
2.7: Minnesota's fatal occupational injury rate in 2018.

One in four fatal workplace injuries involved driving a vehicle.

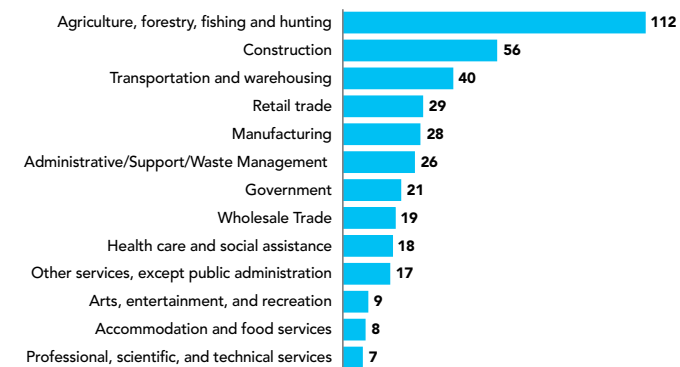
FATALITIES PER YEAR



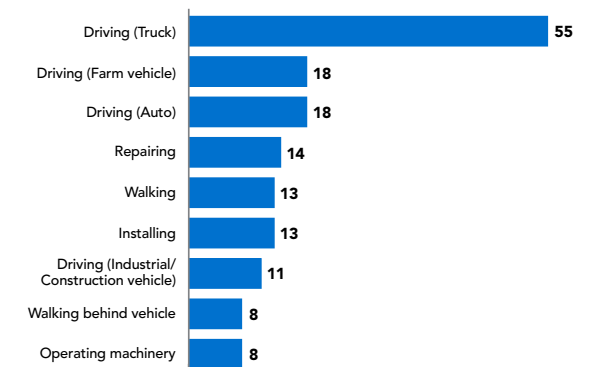
RATE PER 100,000 FTE WORKERS

BY WORKER ACTIVITY, 2014-2018

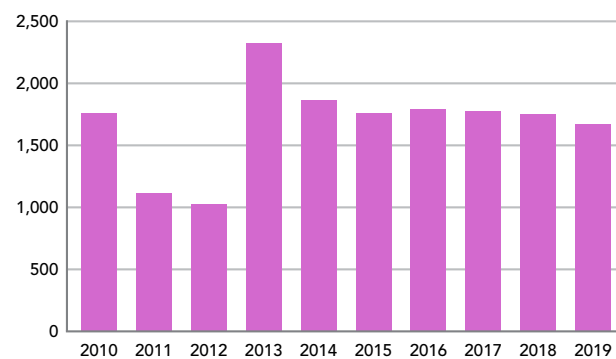


NON-FATAL INJURIES AND ILLNESSES

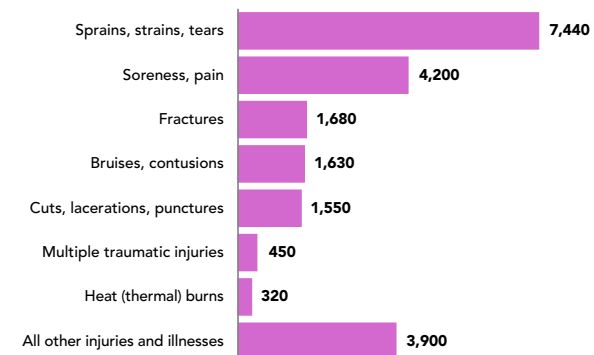
196/day: Number of nonfatal workplace injuries and illnesses, 2018.

INJURY AND ILLNESS TYPES, 2018

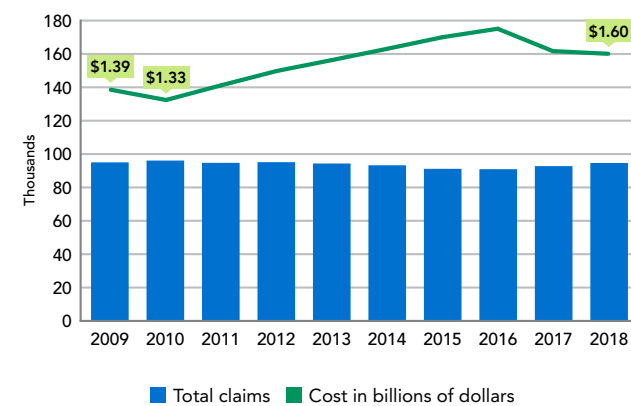

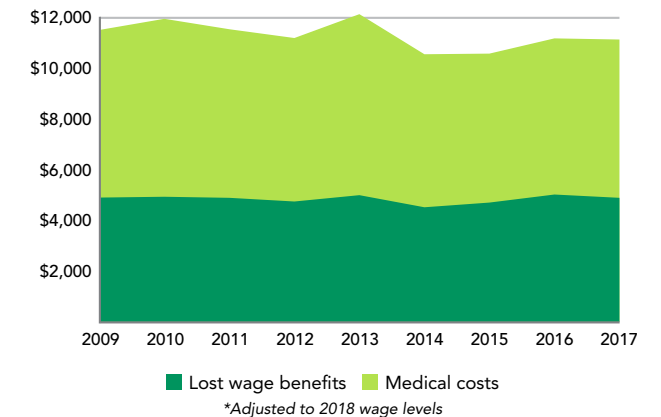
WORKERS' COMPENSATION

CLAIMS AND TOTAL SYSTEM COSTS



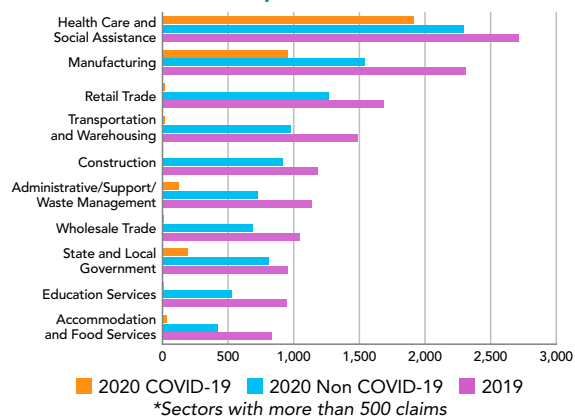
COST PER CLAIM



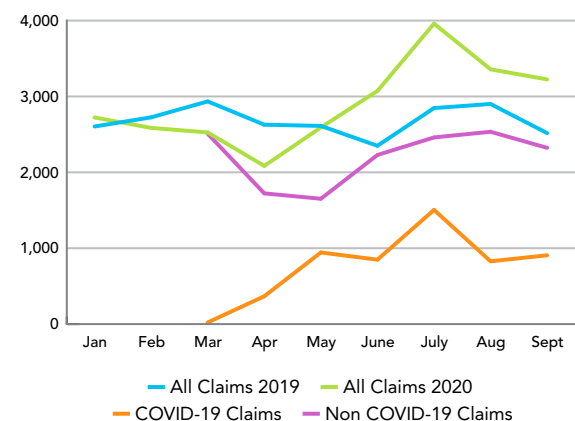

CLAIMS FILED BY INDUSTRY* Jan.-June, 2019 and 2020



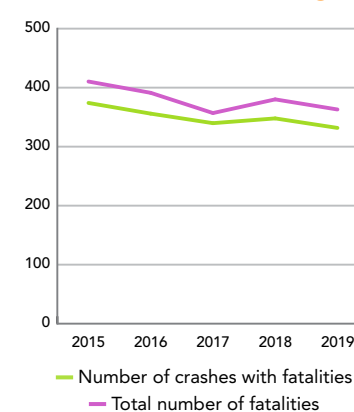
CLAIMS RECEIVED BY MONTH



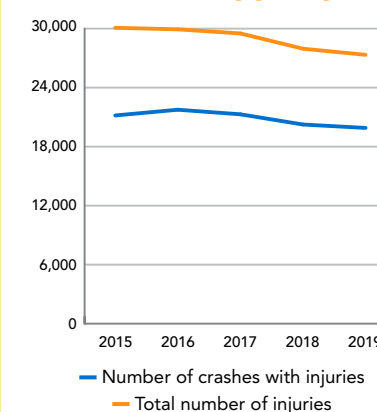
TRAFFIC SAFETY

These figures show all traffic crashes, including work-related crashes.

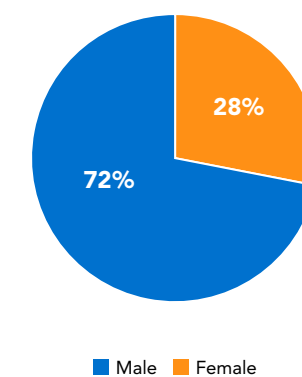
CRASHES WITH FATALITIES



CRASHES WITH INJURIES



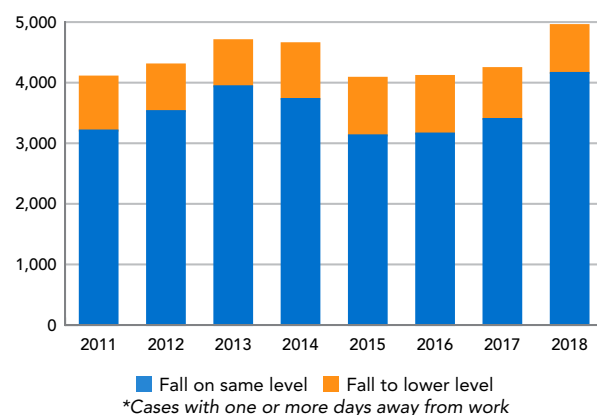
DRIVERS IN FATAL CRASHES



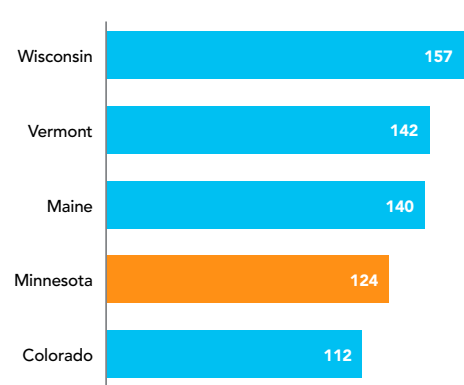
FALLS

FALLS IN THE WORKPLACE Number of Injuries*



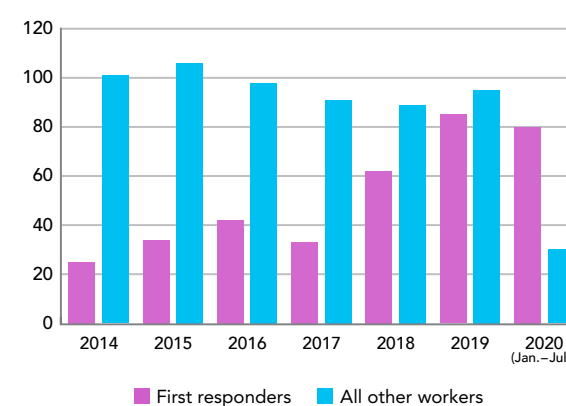
FALLS AT HOME Top 5 Fall Death Rates for Ages 65 and Older
